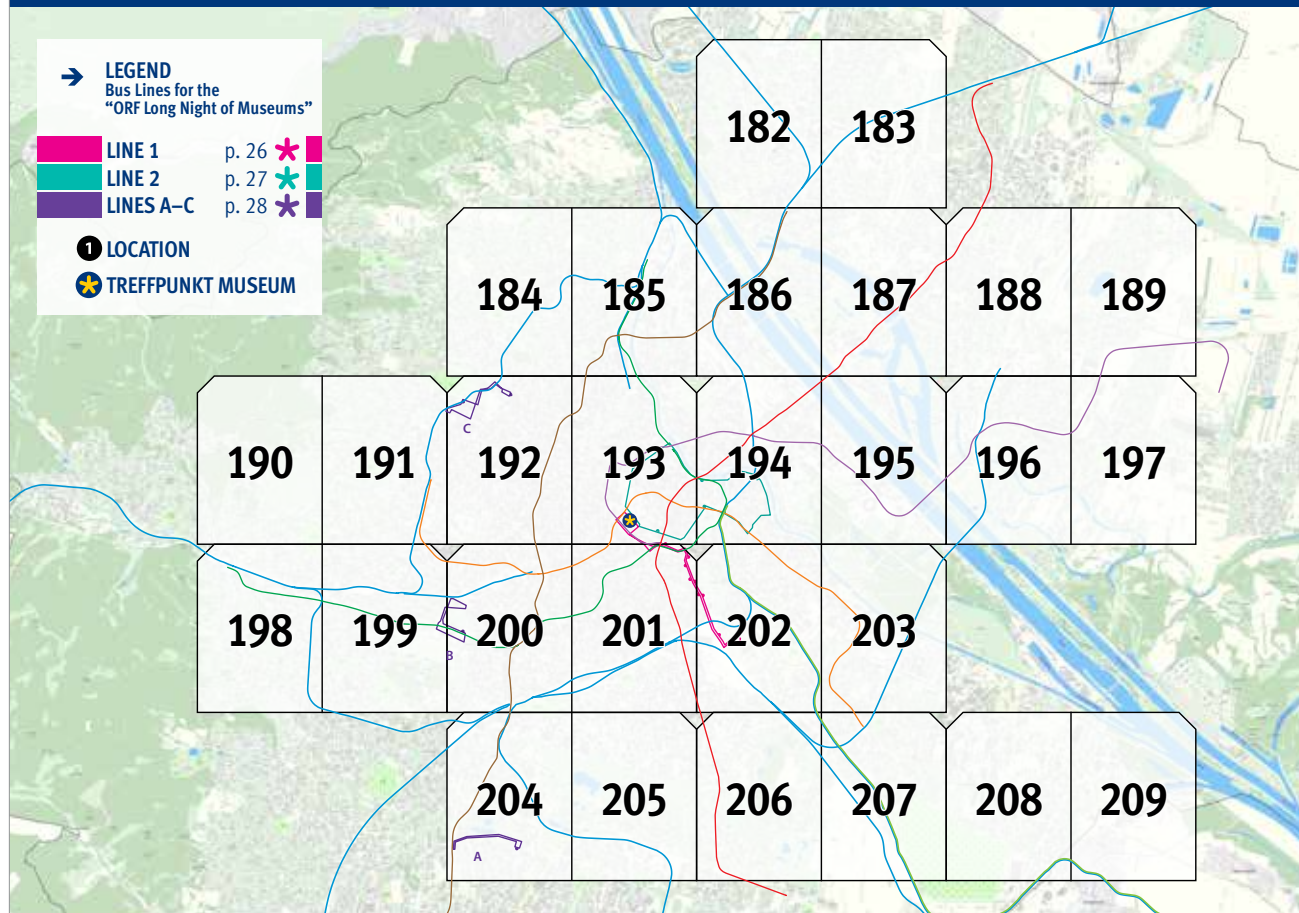







★ GENERAL MAP

- This year, the “ORF Long Night of Museums” will take place for the 20<sup>th</sup> time. And again, there will be ample opportunity to gain an overview of Vienna’s cultural diversity, to discover something new or to deepen what is worth knowing. In Vienna alone, 132 museums and cultural institutions invite culture lovers to a nightly tour. The ORF Wien will be accompanying its audience through this “Long Night”. The TV programme “Wien heute” will report from the last preparations in the museums at 7 pm, provide live coverage and deliver a follow-up report of the highlights on Sunday. On Radio Wien, everything revolves around the “Long Night” between 8 pm and 12 am, with hits and oldies and live reports from the museums. At the MuseumsQuartier Wien, a DJ from Radio Wien will provide good music. The Funkhaus (broadcasting centre) will also open its doors again: Starting every 30 minutes from 6 pm on, visitors can get to know the inside of a broadcasting station on backstage tours.

- Almost 800 museums in Austria preserve the cultural, artistic, and natural heritage for future generations. In times of societal upheaval, museums are essential spaces for public discourse and open up new perspectives on the past, the present, and the future with their collections and objects. In addition to exhibitions, events, and educational programmes, museums are also important places of research outside the university system. Not all of the museum work is visible, though: Museums are mainly responsible for the conservation and expansion of the collections. These tasks are often carried out behind the scenes and with the help of many honorary volunteers, who support the Austrian museums with their commitment. The ticket is valid on October 5<sup>th</sup>, 2019 from 6 pm to 1 am as an **admission ticket** for all locations and events listed in this booklet, and also as a **ticket for public transport services in Vienna**.

On the night itself they can be purchased at the Museum Information Point or at any museum.

### TICKET VALID FOR PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Your ticket for the “Long Night” is also valid for the shuttle buses from 6 pm to 1 am and for **public transport services in Vienna**, including the Nightline buses, from October 5<sup>th</sup>, 2019 5.30 pm to October 6<sup>th</sup>, 2019 1.30 am. Children age 12 and under are allowed to use public transport if accompanied by an adult with a “Long Night” ticket.

### BUS LINES

**Bus lines 1 and 2** start from the **Museum Information Point** at Maria-Theresien-Platz and offer a hop-on-hop-off bus service in intervals of about 15 minutes from 6 pm to 1 am. **Lines A to C** connect underground or city railway stations to locations in Vienna’s outer districts.

### CITY WALK

Locations in the Inner City of Vienna, which are within walking distance, are marked with “**City Walk**” in the booklet.

### CITYBIKE WIEN

For users of Citybike Wien, an additional **mobile Citybike Wien station is installed at the Museum Information Point** during the “ORF Long Night of Museums”.

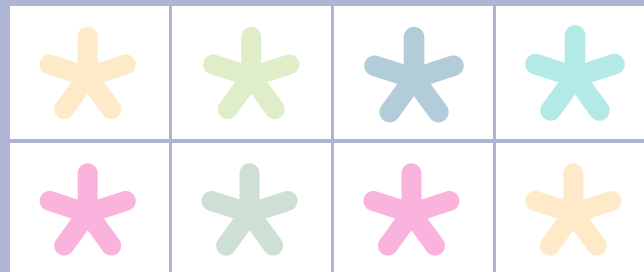

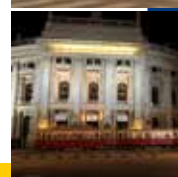


The historical Viennese trams illustrate the development of urban public transport in Vienna. 15 of the exhibits of the VEF (“Verband der Eisenbahnfreunde”, an association of train and tram enthusiasts) are included in the extensive collection of “Remise – The Vienna Transport Museum of Wiener Linien” at Erdberg. Another 16 carriages, which were built between 1913 and 1963, are being used for extra tours. Two authentic trains were assembled from this stock, identical to the ones operated on Vienna’s Ringstraße for many decades. One of the two trains is a typical “M-Dreiwagenzug” (three-carriage train) from 1929, which once gave the tram lines A, Ak, B, and Bk their characteristic appearance. The second one is a carriage train just like the ones that were used on the lines J, T, and D. The vintage trams are marked with “Lange-Nacht-Bim” and will operate on Ringstraße and Kai between 6 pm and 1 am in a clockwise direction. Discover the history of Vienna’s municipal transport first-hand in this “Moving Museum”.

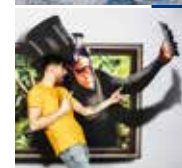

The Old Viennese Schnapsmuseum, which has been in the possession of the Fischer family for five generations, offers a unique insight into the tradition of schnaps and liqueur production. The tour through the museum – from the office from 1904 to the old distillers from the 19<sup>th</sup> century – provides interesting facts about schnaps and will also carry visitors away to the good old days of the monarchy. Some of the recipes of the Friedrich Fischer distillery date back as far as the 19<sup>th</sup> century and have been traditionally passed on from father to son. The Old Viennese Schnapsmuseum continues the tradition of liqueur production and specialises in absinthe.

The Museum of the District of Innere Stadt shows the development of the city of Vienna, which was identical to today’s first district for almost 1,000 years. The formation of the city, of its fortifications, markets, churches, and palaces is presented in the form of a walk-in picture book with exhibits, maps, images, and documents. The era of Maria Theresia and the Congress of Vienna are documented in pictures.

Emperor Franz Joseph’s era started with the bourgeois uprising of 1848. His decision to have the city walls torn down paved the way for the development of Vienna towards becoming a European metropolis. Unique exhibits reflect this era, which ended abruptly in 1914. They are complemented by interesting showpieces up to today.

The Old Town Hall has been in the possession of the City of Vienna since 1316. It served as the seat of the City Council and the Mayor of Vienna for more than 550 years. On May 26<sup>th</sup>, 1848, during the days of the Revolution in Vienna, the Committee of Safety for the Maintenance of Order, which had been elected by the Viennese people, met in the Old Town Hall. Meetings of the City Council took place on this site before they moved to the new City Hall. Today, part of the Old Town Hall houses the District Council of Innere Stadt (1<sup>st</sup> district). The Coat of Arms Hall and the former Council Chamber provide a good insight into the past.

The Viennese bakers' guild was first mentioned in records from 1227. Since 1895, the property in Florianigasse 13 has been in the possession of the guild. An additional building in the style of the German Renaissance was added to the courtyard in 1898 to be used for administration, training and further education.

Since 2000, the guild house has been the centre of the Viennese catering trades (bakers, butchers, confectioners) and other food trades.



During the "ORF Long Night of Museums", the banquet hall will be open to the general public. Short films will give an insight into historical details of the catering trades. Master bakers and confectioners will show their craft in the guild's workshop.

### HALF A MILLENNIUM



On the 1<sup>st</sup> floor: the historical part of the Bakers' Museum includes 38 certificates, 7762 documents and 125 volumes of manuscripts. Moreover, there are countless historical objects and the ballroom, which is especially worth seeing. All that amounts to half a millennium of bakers' trade history.

At the Condomi Museum, you will see everything! From the early beginnings, when sheepskin and co. were still used as a protection against diseases, to odd inventions and ideas concerning condoms and contraception. Condoms out of latex have existed since the 1920s. Still untested at that time, they have undergone considerable transformations since. Being the only way of contraception before the 60s and the invention of the pill, they were later reserved for visits to brothels and had to be freed from taboos again in the 80s and 90s. Today, condoms are considered very modern, being essential in the prevention of sexually transmittable diseases. They are available in vegan and fair trade versions or even latex free and are often used as an alternative to hormonal contraception again.

A collection, which has been compiled with special care over more than 20 years, shows the development of machine-made condoms over a period of almost 100 years. It is located in the vaulted cellar of the shop Liebenswert on 100 sqm.

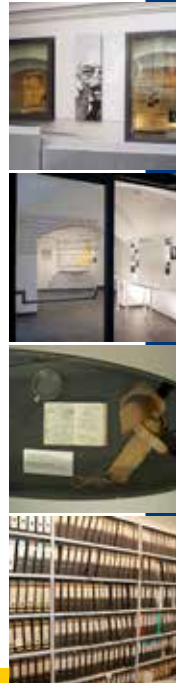

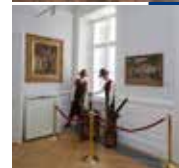

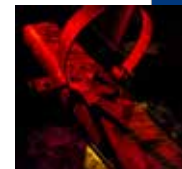

The organisers of this museum strongly oppose torture. The purpose of exhibiting tools of execution and punishment is to act as a warning. 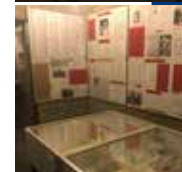
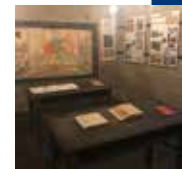

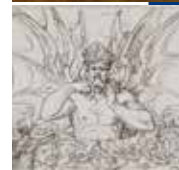

The Kuffner Observatory, an edifice from the time of Historism, is located on Gallitzinberg in the district of Ottakring. It used to belong to an industrial magnate of the Austro-Hungarian Monarchy and has still retained its historical appearance. The Kuffner Observatory is home to a significant collection of astronomical instruments from the 19<sup>th</sup> century, made by the renowned companies Repsold and Sons in Hamburg and Steinheil in Munich. The great refractor, the meridian circle, the vertical circle, and the heliometer were restored between 1993 and 2002 and adapted for the use in education and in the museum. Currently, astronomy tours and seminars for the public are offered all year round.

The Museum of Aspern-Essling offers an overview of the military conflict between the French and the Austrian troops in May 1809 by displaying different sorts of weapons, uniforms, letters, bullets, and pictures of the military leaders. In 1858, Archduke Albrecht had a monument erected to commemorate the victims of that war. This monument, the “Lion of Aspern”, was built by the sculptor Anton Fernkorn. The lion is portrayed lying on French banners. The French Eagle and the flags are the symbols of the French cavalry. The animal’s head is positioned on a French helmet. The lion symbolises the brave soldiers. The victory of soldiers of a German-speaking country over the French army is represented by the oak leaves around the pedestal. In the face of the dying lion, you can read melancholy and anger, in its posture strength and steeliness. Pressing his nails into the stone, the animal is dying.

The author Hans Holba provides information on walking tours in the Lobau.

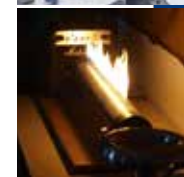

The world's first and only museum of contraception and abortion has been getting to the bottom of these questions since 2007. With the aid of objects, pictures, and stories, the MUVS recounts the bitter struggle for control of fertility. Starting from antiquity and going through the Middle Ages, right up to the present day, with a look to the future, medical, political and social developments are documented and discussed.

About 100 years ago, fertility still meant that a woman's life was marked by 15 pregnancies, 10 births and 8 children on average. Mankind had first to learn, through a long and arduous process, how to adapt this natural degree of fertility to the number of children desired by each individual/couple. It is only because of this that today, in many places, we are able to live with autonomy over our sexuality and fertility.

A visit to the MUVS touches, moves and amazes. Perhaps you will be a little more thoughtful when you leave than when you came in.

In the Museum at the Schottenstift, you are invited on a zoological tour of the collections. Clues to animals can be found in all areas of the abbey museum: In manuscripts, on paintings, and in the natural history cabinet. You will be surprised how much more there is behind all that!

The high altar by the “Schottenmeister”, featuring the oldest topographically accurate representation of medieval Vienna, is also particularly worth seeing. The exhibition includes numerous paintings from the 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> centuries and the time of Biedermeier in Vienna as well as furniture and liturgical utensils.

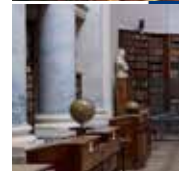

They all grew up as Jewish children in Vienna, had to leave their home after the "Anschluss," the annexation of Austria to Nazi Germany, and became successful elsewhere. Lily Renée (\*1921) made a career in New York as a graphic artist and illustrator. Wilhelm "Bil" Spira (1913–1999) continued his successful career as portraitist, caricaturist, and painter in Paris. Paul Peter Porges (1927–2016) contributed cartoons and illustrations to some of the most prominent magazines in the USA, first and foremost "The New Yorker".

Despite its size, the Northwest Railway Station appears to be hardly anchored in the general awareness of the Viennese. Before the area will have to yield to a new housing project, an exhibition on-site intends to remind a broad audience of the changeful history and present of this last of the logistics hubs close to the city centre. Embedded in the social environment of the logistics landscape, the museum shows a multilayered multimedia mapping on the history of the area by means of photographs, films, objects, maps, and models. The exhibition room also serves as a vessel for communicating and gathering in the very midst of the research space, thus fostering interaction and trust between experts of everyday life in the area. The presentation shows the companies which once shaped the area or still do so today. Stories on the logistics routine and on individual experiences of migration or mobility have been collected in interviews and conversations, combined with provided material and successively intensified in the exhibition.

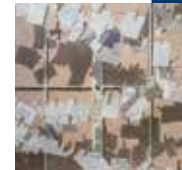

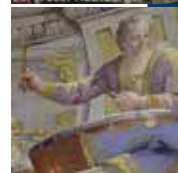

Since the year 2000, the building of the KR Hans Zellhofer foundation for chemists has accommodated the Museum of Pharmacy and Chemists, which has been continuously expanded and turned into a gem of a museum in the 9<sup>th</sup> district.

The museum presents living knowledge from tradition and progress. Its highlights are an extensive herb collection, Dr. Franz Berger's "Herbarium" with more than 6,000 herbal samples, and four luxury volumes of nature prints with 585 boards of vascular plants, 100 of which were produced for the world's fair in Paris in 1855. Moreover, the exhibition shows presents from the expedition of the Africanist scholar Dr. Emil Holub, such as an Egyptian mummy's head, also a homeopathic first aid kit, which was used in home visits by doctors centuries ago, and a "resorbiteur", which is one of the oldest patented contraceptives. Items that may surprise you include Theriak, dragon's blood, the Spanish fly, the Kerria lacca, and "red colour with six legs" as well as an extensive library with more than 2,000 reference books, fascinating cameras, and equipment, mortars, scales and jars from different eras.

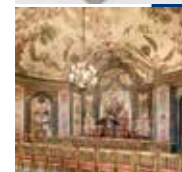
In Vienna's heart, right beside St. Stephen's Cathedral, the Teutonic Order's treasury enshrines valuable objects from its more than 500-year-old history. In the chambers of the Teutonic Order's house the treasures of an eventful past, the art appreciation of important Order's members, and the Order's connection with the contemporary art and its creations present themselves. The main focus of the collection of the ancient Order of Knights is on the Gothic period, on the Renaissance, and on the Baroque period. Goldsmiths' works, insignia, ceremonial weapons, clocks, and tableware belong to this treasure. Paintings, coins and some documents selected from the Teutonic Order's central archive are also exhibited. The overwhelming splendor of the jewels leads you through the history of the Order.

Being funded by the City of Vienna and private sponsors, the museum fulfils the function of an art-historical and historical museum of audio technology in all its aspects. As a special museum of the consortium of district museums, it is also obliged to contribute to the collective conservation and living tradition of audio technology and the corresponding recording media. The collection includes phonographs, gramophones, radios, and remarkable mechanical musical instruments. #### MUSEUMS IN MÜRZZUSCHLAG

The ride along the Semmering Railway takes you to Mürzzuschlag and a varied museum programme. (Arrival at approx. 6.15 pm).

#### HÖLLENTAL TRAIN PAYERBACH-REICHENAU

Departure from Mürzzuschlag at approx. 9 pm to Payerbach-Reichenau. The journey continues on the Höllental train to the depot in Hirschwang. A tour of the transducer facility in Reichenau is also part of the trip. (Duration approx. 2 hours).

#### JOURNEY BACK FROM PAYERBACH-REICHENAU

On the return of the Höllental train to Payerbach (approx. 11.35 pm), the nostalgic train ride will continue, calling at Wr. Neustadt and Vienna. (Arrival in Vienna at approx. 1.30 am).

**NOTE** Tickets for the “ORF Long Night of Museums” are valid for this ride and can also be purchased on the train. A dining car operates on the nostalgic train, where refreshments, coffee, and snacks are offered.

















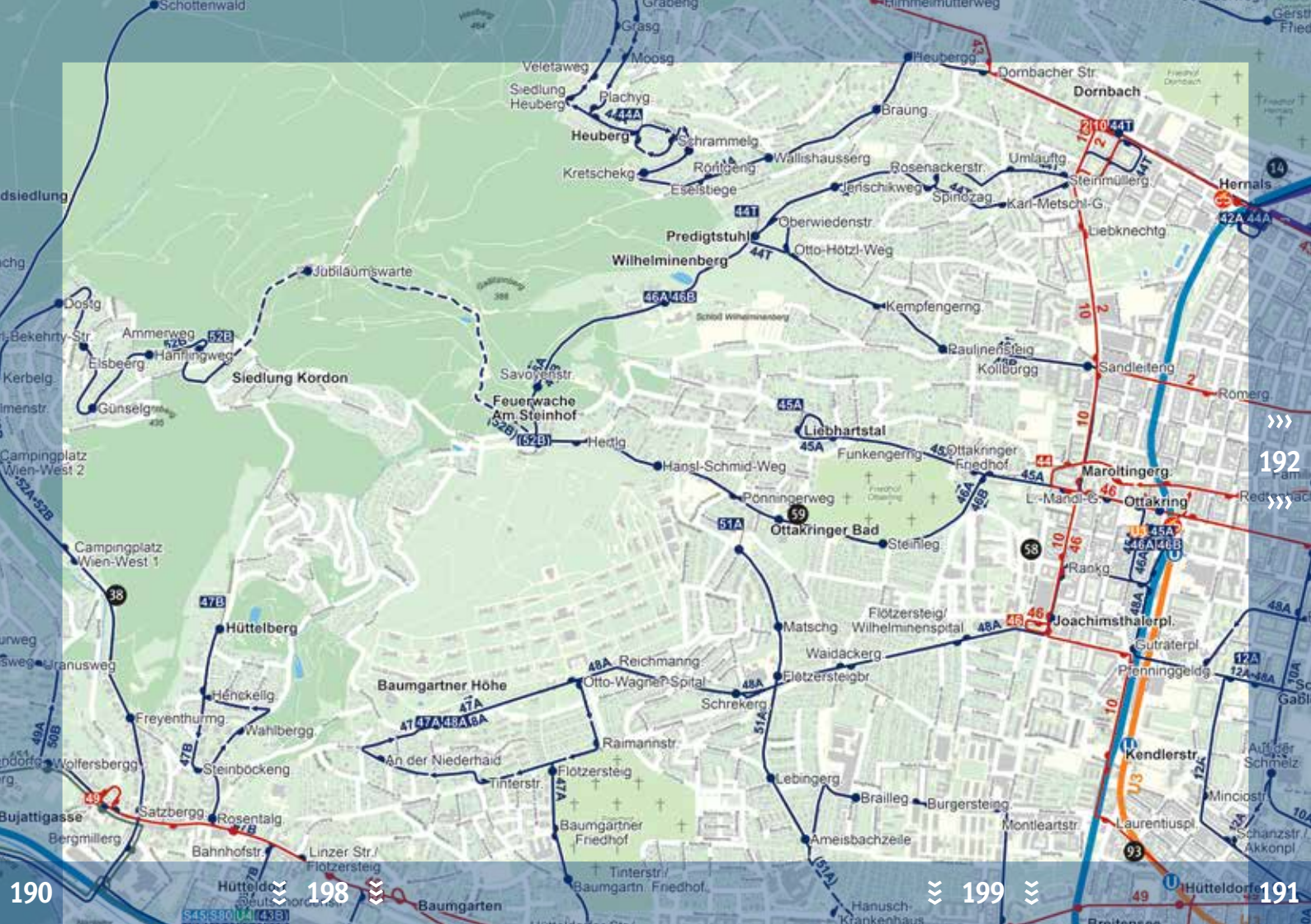












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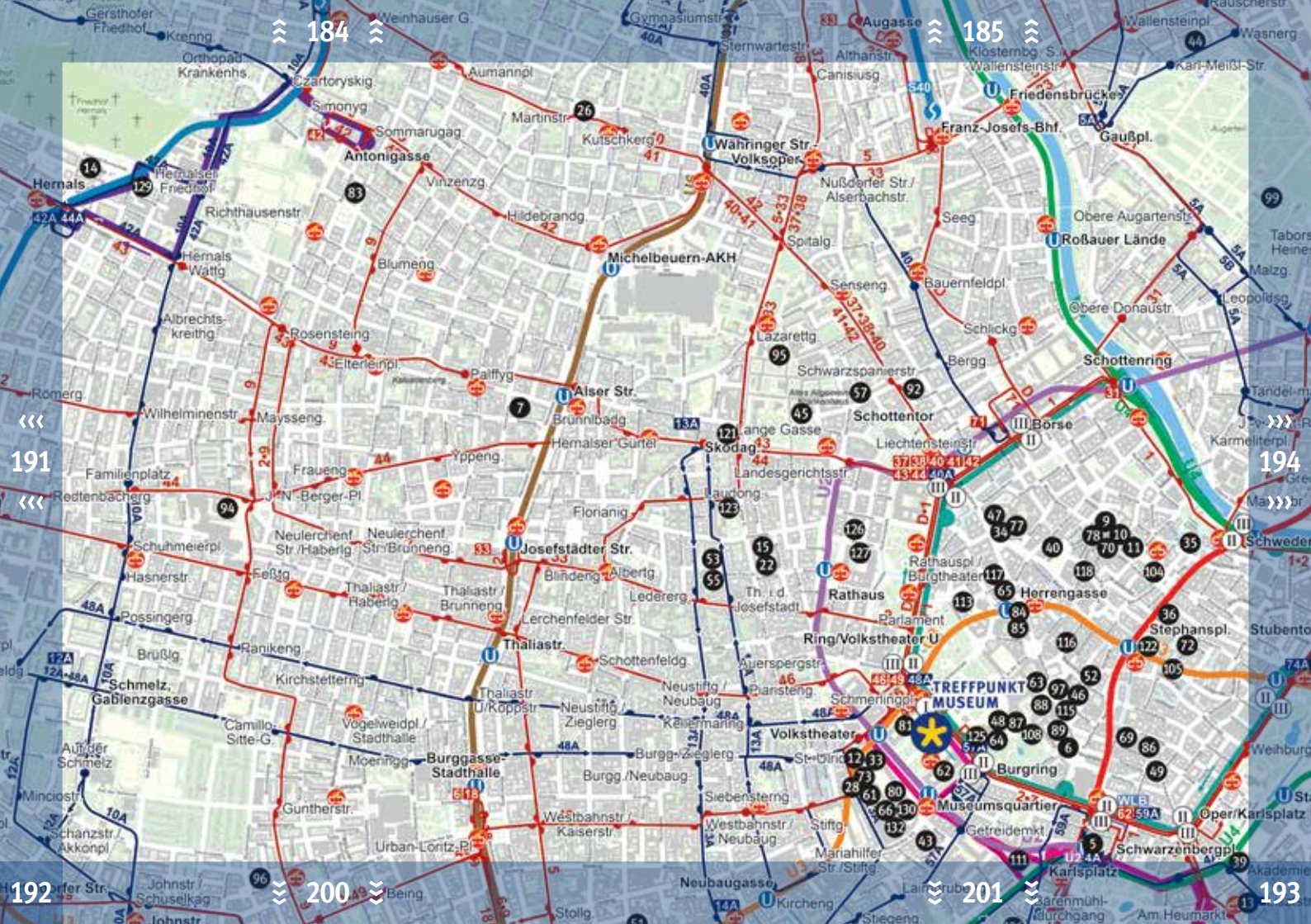
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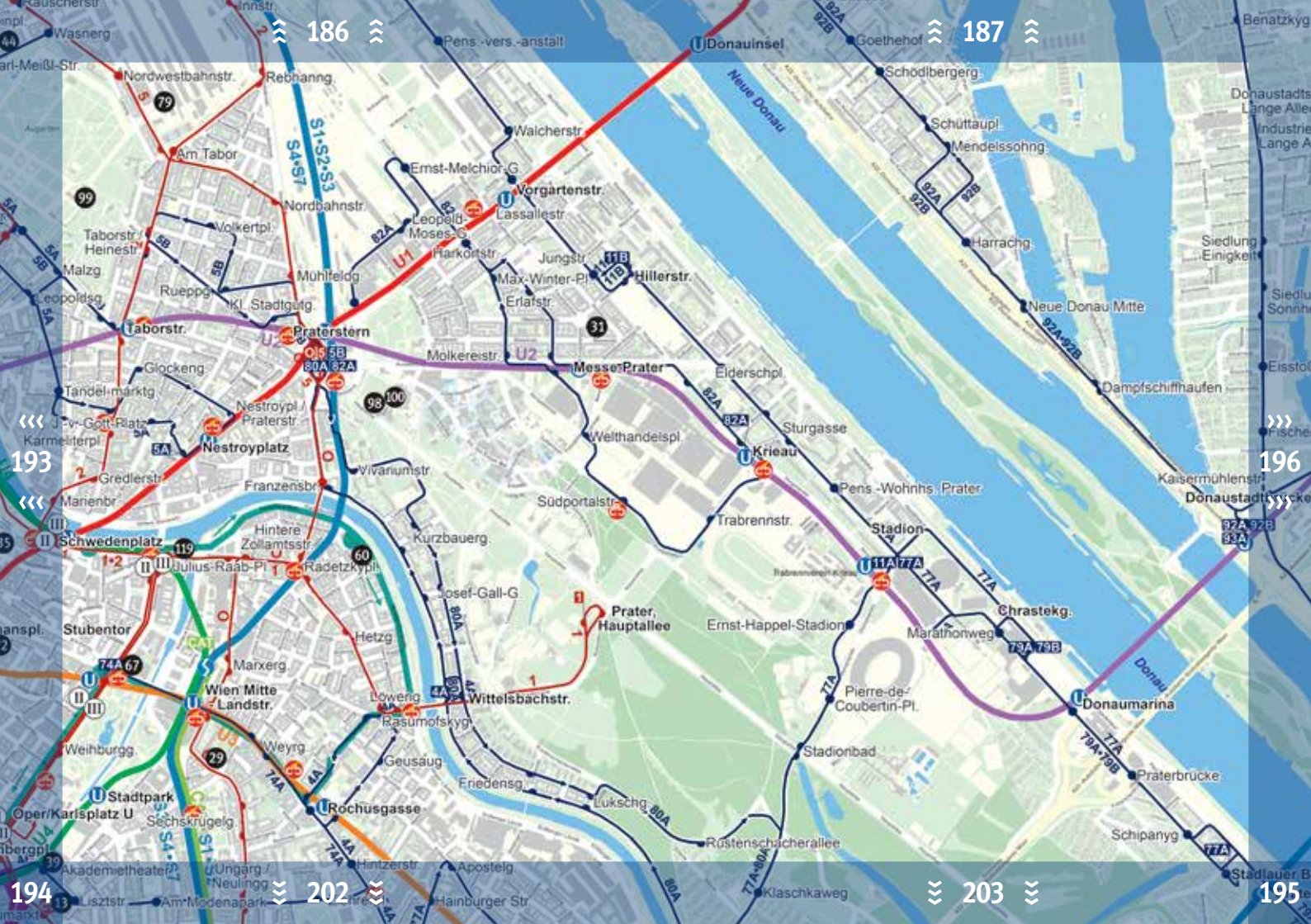
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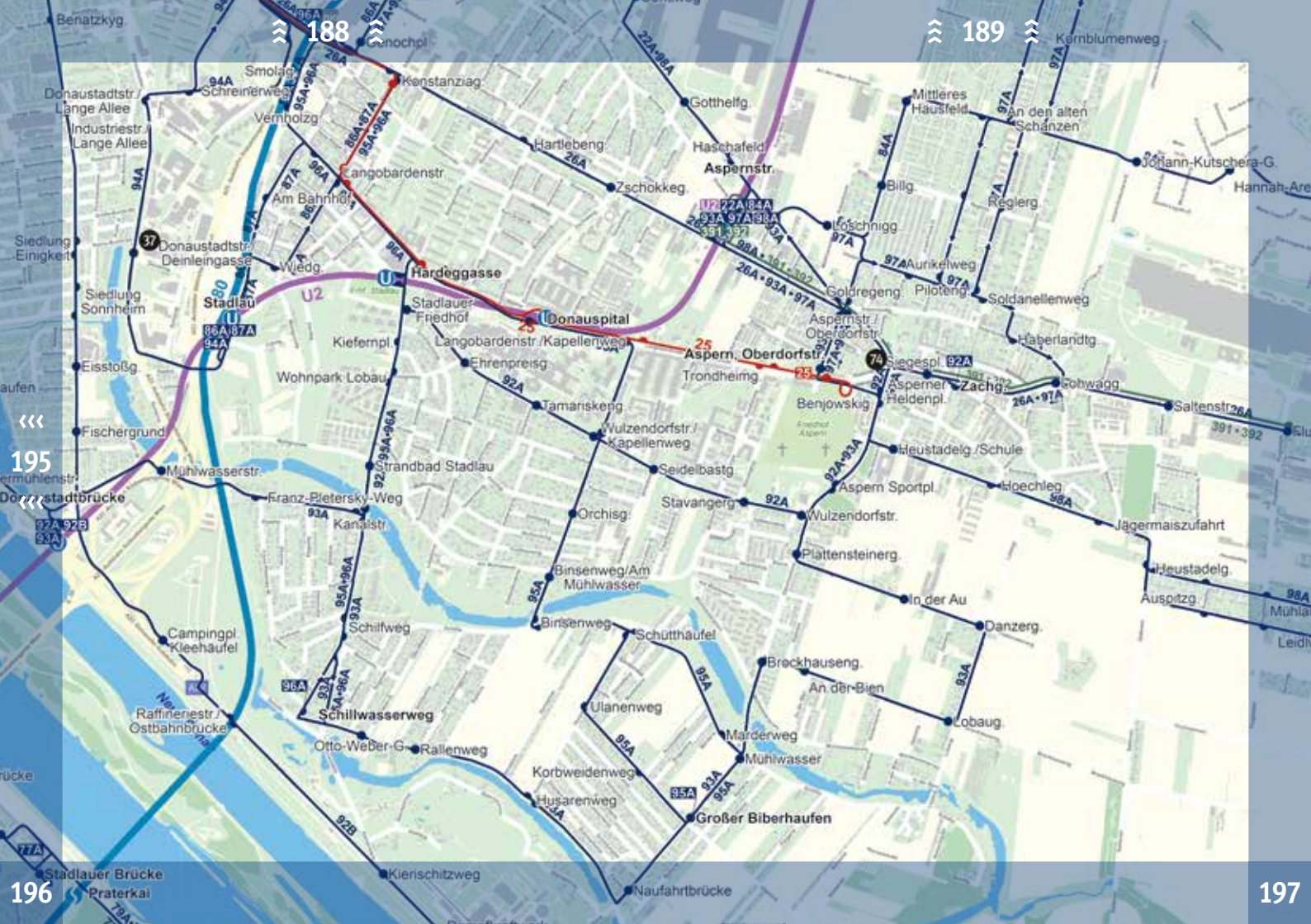
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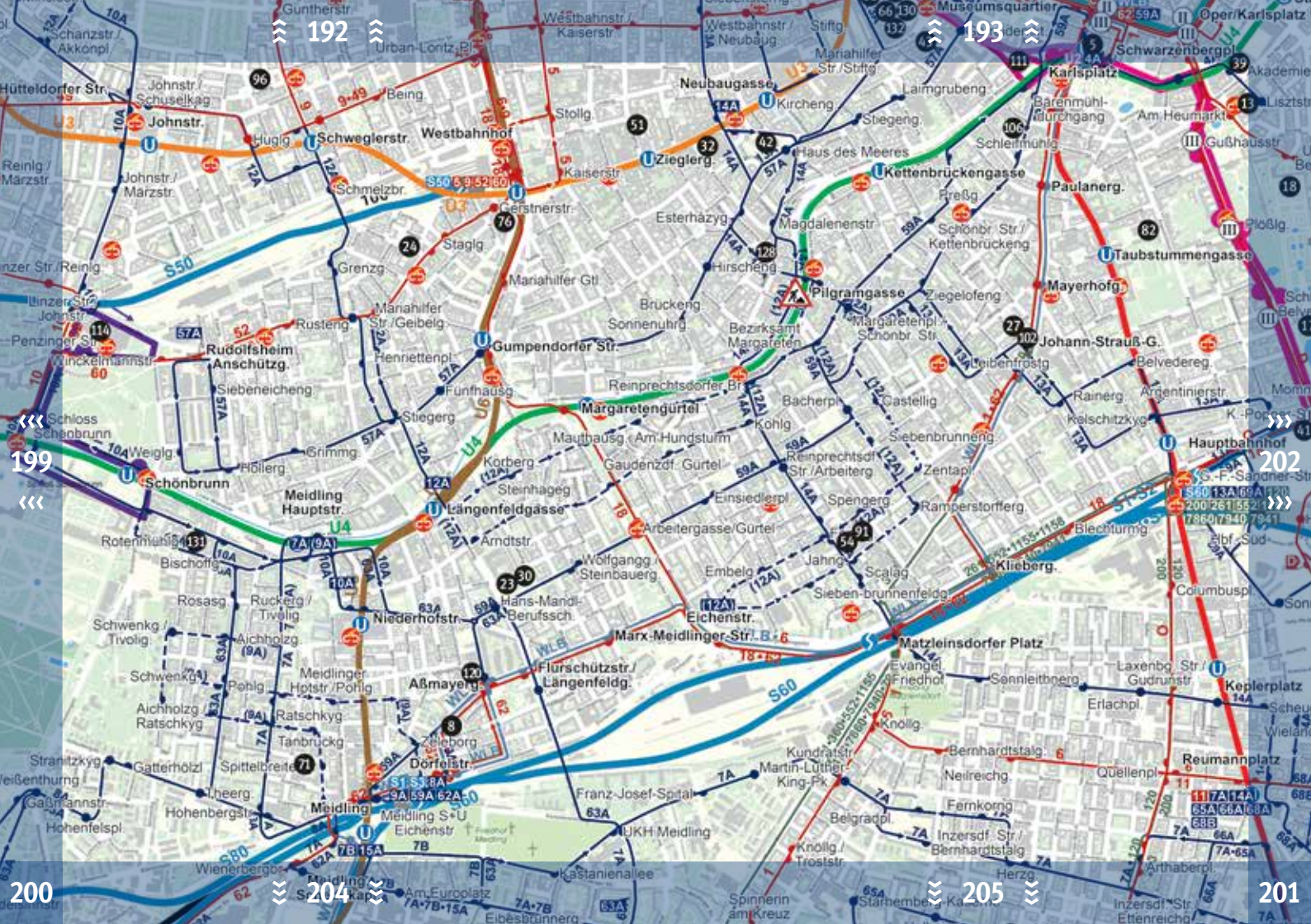
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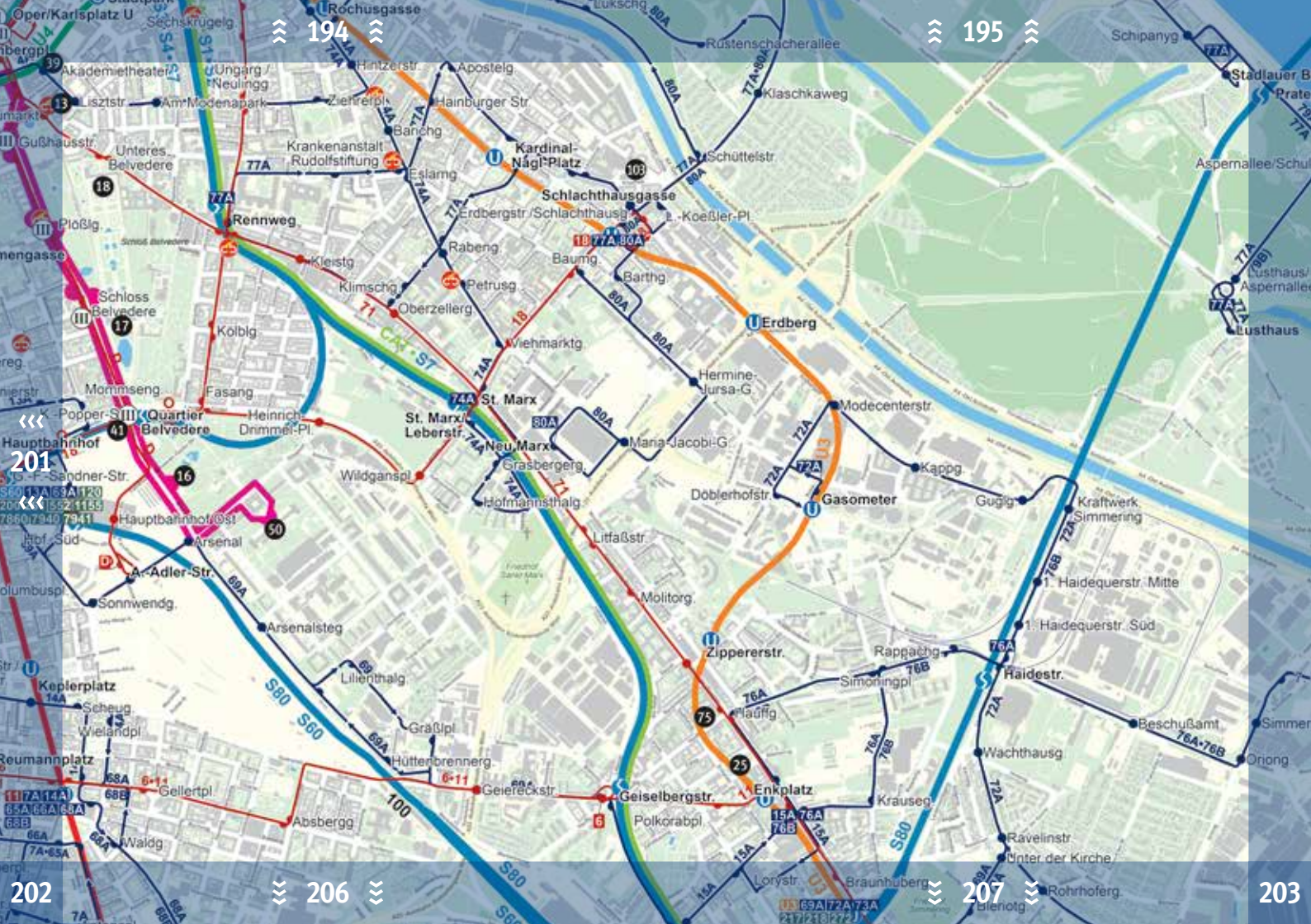
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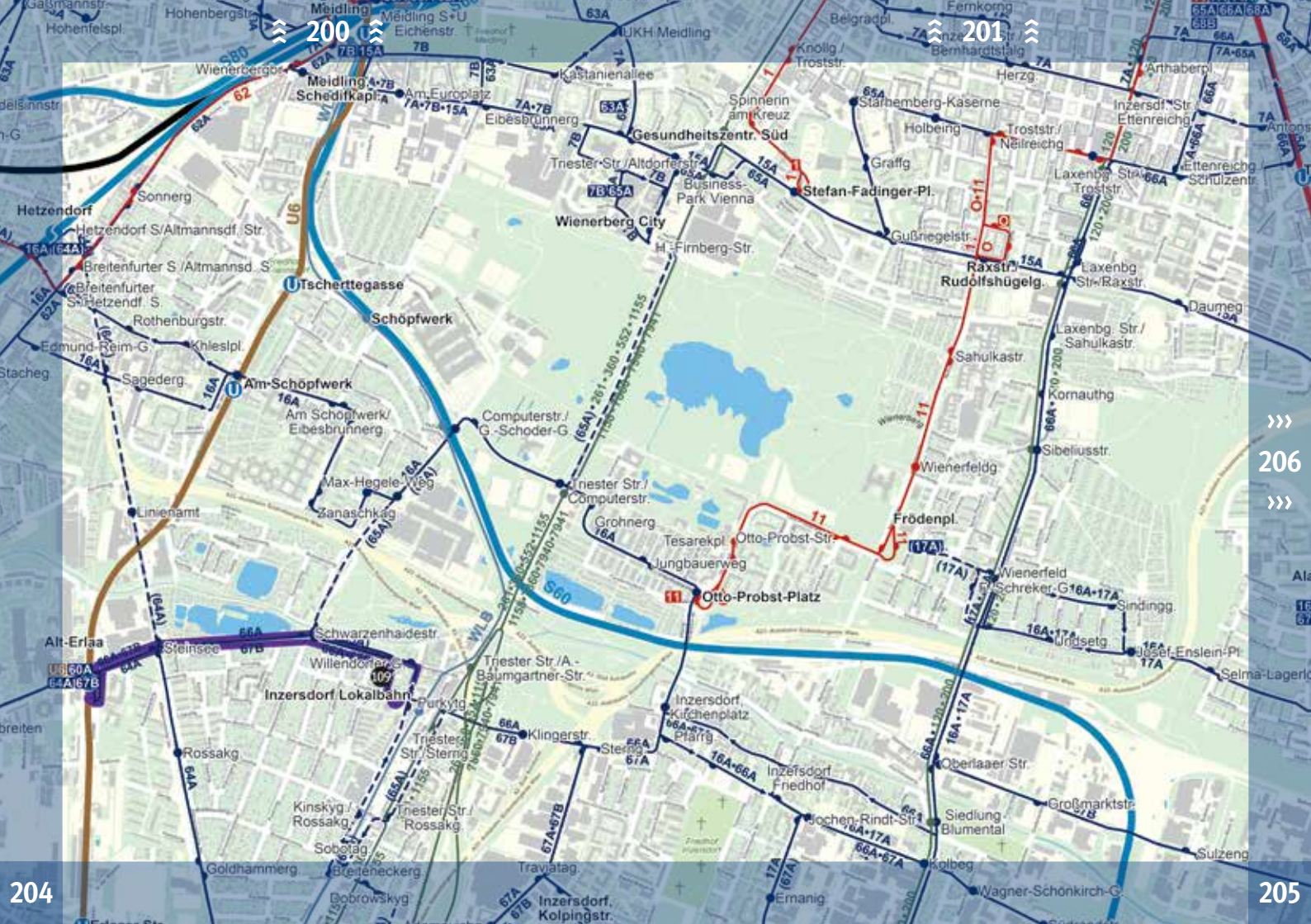
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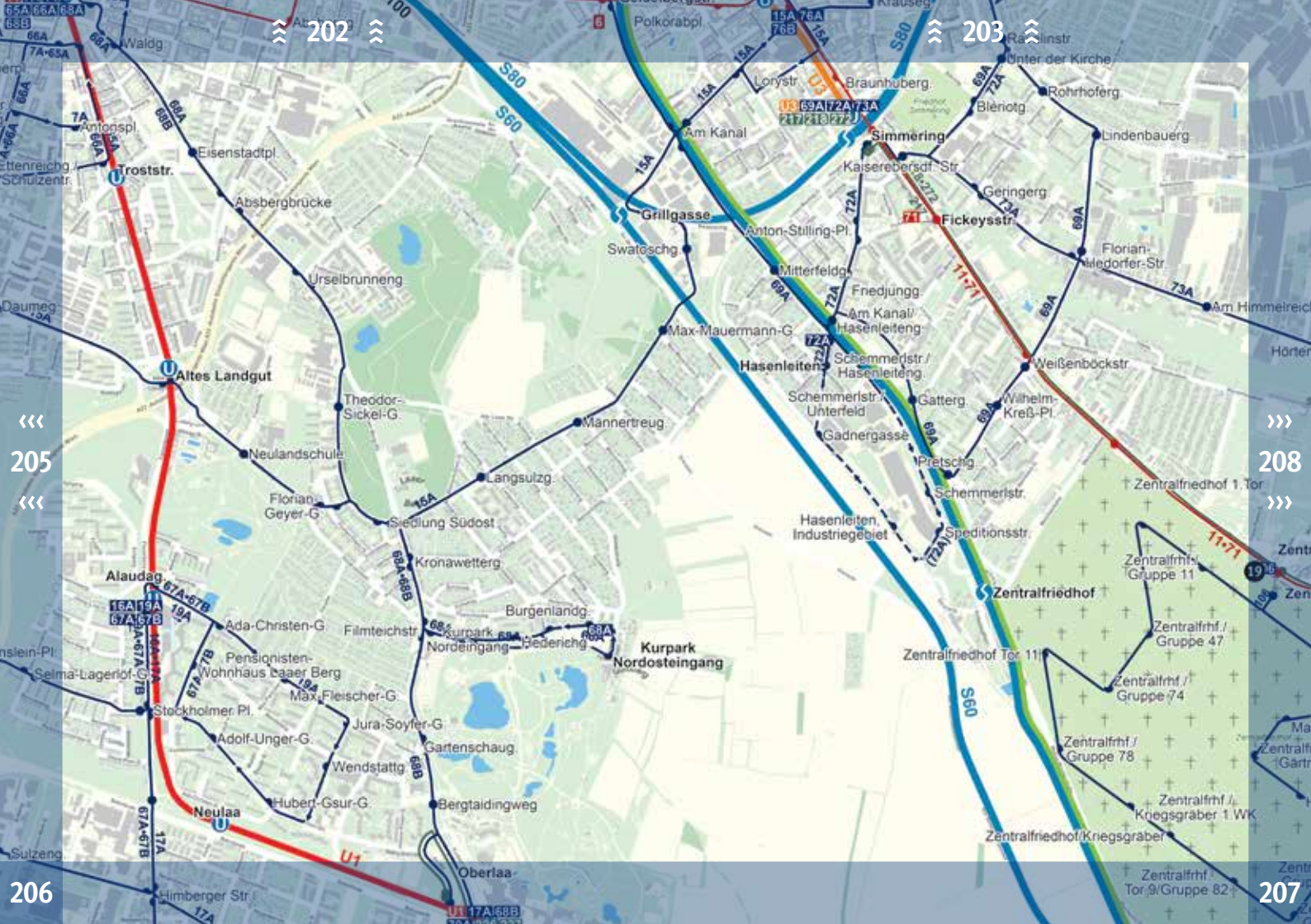
